Food Security Situation*

- Despite growth in recent years, three decades of war, civil unrest and recurring natural disasters have left Afghanistan one of the poorest countries in the world. Millions of Afghans still live in severe poverty, with more than half the population living below the poverty line.

- Households in the southern conflict affected areas are likely to be moderately to highly food insecure, with IDPs and refugees repatriated from Pakistan facing the worst food security conditions.

- Despite the conflict and 2011 drought in the Northern part of the country, lower wheat flour prices, increased rain/snow fall, and external assistance have combined to improve the food security outlook for 2012. However, households in the North, particularly the northwest, will continue to require food assistance until the 2012 harvest.
