Food Security Situation*

- According to FEWSNET, approx. 4.3 million people are highly or moderately food insecure. Approximately 3.75 million farmers and pastoralists targeted by WFP have experienced two to three successive seasons of inadequate or failed rainfall and will remain food - insecure through at least Feb. 2012.

- Food security for pastoral households in Kenya's north, northeast, and southern Maasai rangelands is anticipated to improve by end -CY 2011 when livestock will have returned to wet-season grazing areas. Other pastoralists having seen livestock losses ranging between 15-20 percent will require several months to recover their livelihoods.

- Almost 85% of the more than 556,000 refugees and asylum-seekers in Kenya are from Somalia, the balance from S. Sudan & S. Ethiopia. The food security of refugees arriving in Dadaab's camps remains precarious.
