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Food Security Situation*

- Somalia remains in a precarious food security situation as a result of 20 years of persistent civil conflicts and civilian displacement, recurrent droughts and erratic rainfall, severe floods, crop failures, and high malnutrition rates.
- Approximately 2.4 million people – including approximately 1.46 million IDPs – require emergency humanitarian assistance and livelihood support.
- Increasing insecurity, decreasing humanitarian access, and continuing drought conditions in central and southern regions are resulting in large scale displacement, destruction of homes and property, and disruption of trade and market activities.
- A La Niña climate event has negatively affected rainfall levels in late 2010 and is expected to continue to have adverse impacts on rainfall levels in Somalia throughout 2011.
